Advocates and partners engage in the community in a wide variety of ways

### Building blocks of relationship...

When talking to people about what it means to be a Citizen Advocate, it is sometimes assumed that they need some kind of training, experience, or qualification. Why is that?

People with disabilities are often surrounded primarily by staff who are paid to be there. This perpetuates the ongoing perception that you have to have a professional role or prior experience to spend time with someone who has a disability.

*“Research has shown over and over again that the percentage of ordinary community members in the social network of a person with disabilities is usually very small. The majority of relationships are family members, staff, and other people with disabilities. One study found that 60% of individuals in group homes had no friends who were community members.” Angela Novak Amado, Ph.D.*

At Citizen Advocacy, we ask ordinary people to do ordinary things; spending time, creating opportunity, listening, learning, encouraging, making phone calls, asking questions, finding solutions, thinking ahead, planning, driving, seeking alternatives, caring, laughing, challenging the status quo, experiencing, struggling, trying, failing, succeeding, growing, changing, witnessing...

These are many of the experiences that are possible when we invite advocates into relationships. Most are experiences that happen multiple times throughout the day. They are ordinary things. Done everyday. But, for some people they never happen. Citizen Advocates are often the only and first person in someone’s life choosing to be there. Citizen Advocates consistently show up because they want to. Advocates are active in the lives of their partners because they care. **We ask ordinary people to do ordinary things of extraordinary importance.**
