Over 40 years of Citizen Advocacy of Chester County...

We celebrated our 40th (+2!) anniversary this past September at the Kimberton Fairgrounds, surrounded by friends both new and old! As we look back on over four decades of Citizen Advocacy, we feel so grateful for everyone who has supported our work in a variety of different ways - from helping with moves (we're back on Church Street!); attending our events; serving on our board, and committees; helping with mailings; or just popping in to say hi, we truly appreciate everyone who has been part of our story.

Since 1980, we have made almost 300 matches and currently support 49 active Citizen Advocacy relationships. Our longest match is 34 years old! These matches are the heart of our work and continuously remind us why we love being a part of the Phoenixville community. We wanted to share some stories with you of advocates and partners working together over the last year:

- One advocate used his own contacts to find and move his partner to a new safe apartment within walking distance of laundry facilities and public transportation. The partner is now receiving medical/dental services, daily meals from Meals on Wheels, and transportation from Rover.
- Last summer, an advocate who is the ED of a community theater, realized that the theater is not accessible for her partner and is now looking at ways to improve the entire theater to make it welcoming for all.
- One advocate continues to provide transportation to her partner to get to work, social, and medical appointments, as well as helping her navigate the complex medical issues she confronts.
- One advocate recently helped her partner work through moving into a new home as transitions are extremely challenging for her.
- One of our matches enjoys taking their dogs for a walk and baking together. They both see each other weekly and the partner has become a part of her family life.
- In the past year we had crisis advocates work towards moving a partner out of a local nursing home that was not working towards healing him.

Thank you for helping us make this important work happen and for making our community a safer and better place for all of us! Here's to 40 more years!




